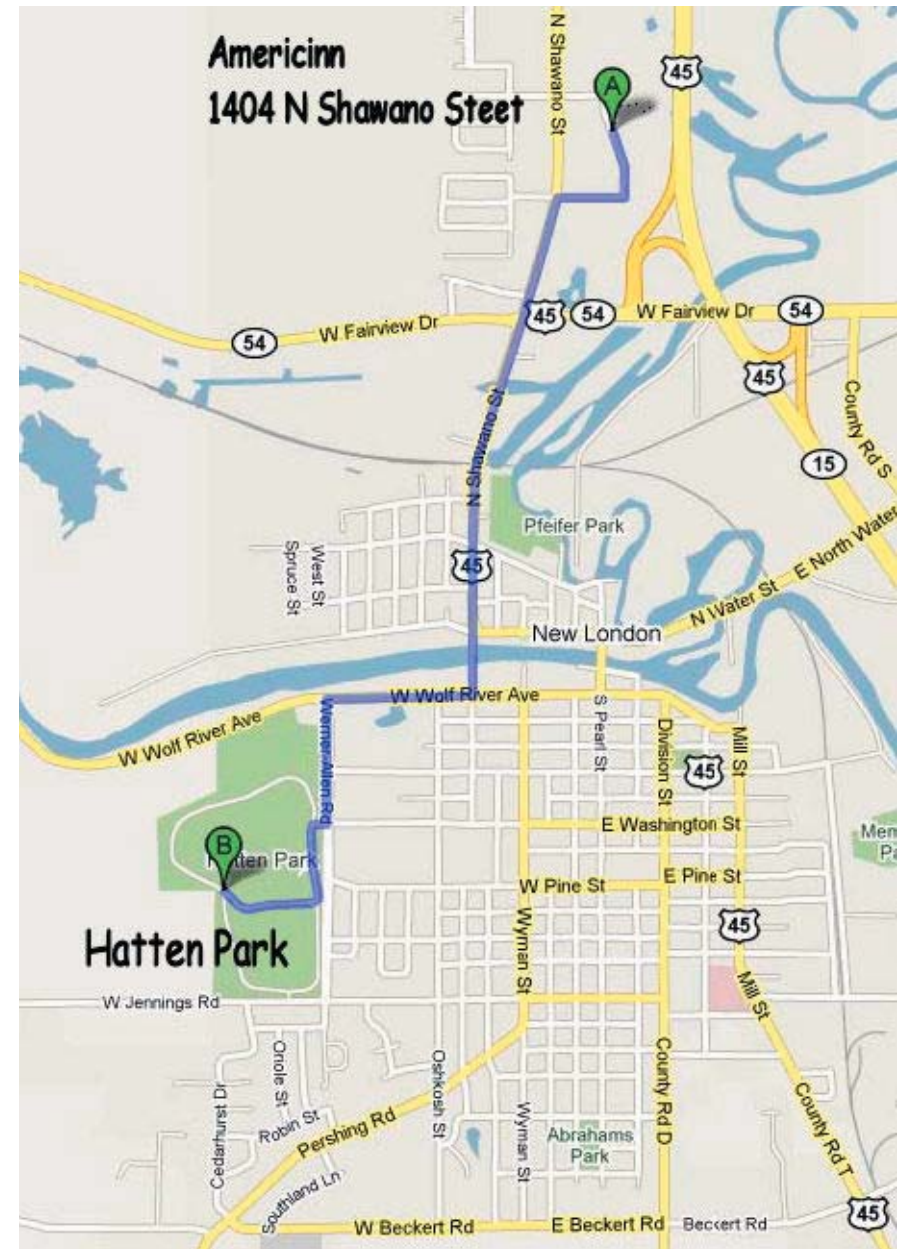
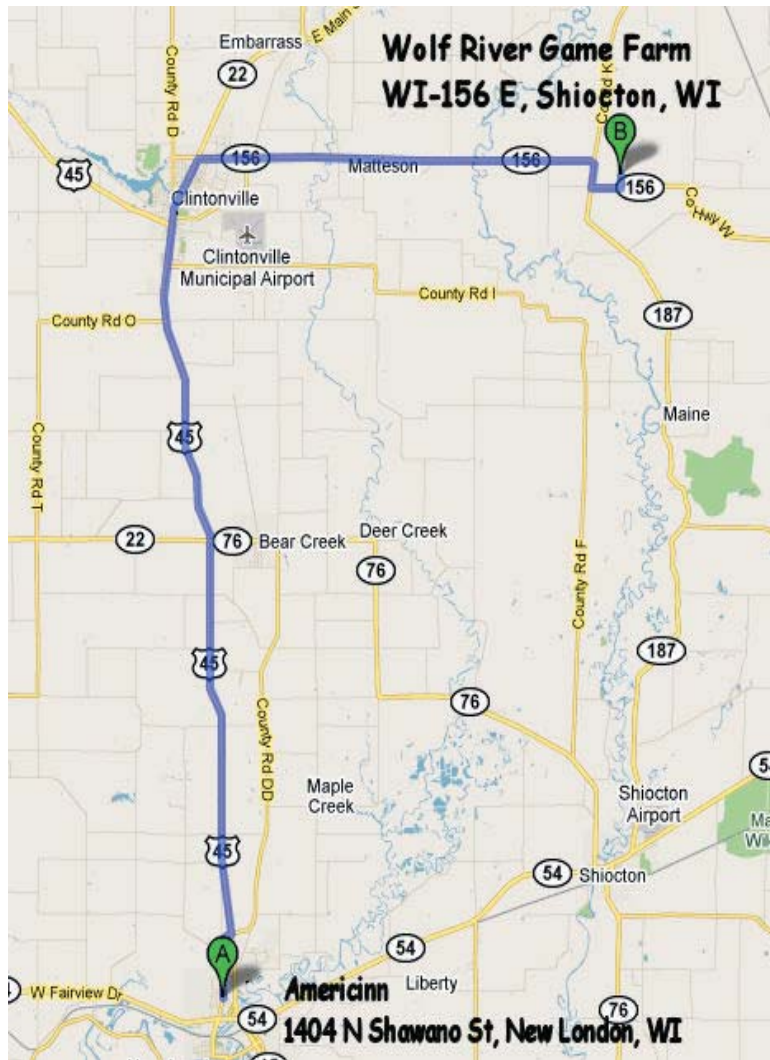

### Handlers Clinic - August 11

The AWSC Field Events Committee will be holding a Handlers' Clinic to help prepare you to run the AWSC hunt tests. We want to help you improve your handling skills so that you feel more comfortable at the line and in the field, so that you can communicate better with your dog and to help make running the AWSC hunt tests a more pleasurable experience. You will receive helpful tips on how to handle your dog within the rules of the level you are running and how to improve your performance and the performance of your dog.

The fee for this event is just \$10 to help defray the cost of the grounds. If you want chukars for the upland work they are \$9.00 each. A few ducks will be provided by the Field Events Committee for the water work at no charge to participants. Please indicate on your registration form the level at which you are running, your experience and how many chukars you are ordering. Payment is due at time of registration. Please pre-register by Aug. 4th. Space may be available the day of the clinic but birds must be pre-ordered.

### Judges Education Seminar - August 11

The seminar will consist of two parts - the first part being a field demonstration, which will be held at Wolf River Game Farm beginning at 1:30 p.m. The second part will be held at the Americinn Motel at 3:30 p.m. for a Power Point presentation with a hands-on - an opportunity for the judges to go over some dogs.

### Canine Cancer Research Seminar - August 11

Everyone is welcome to this educational evening presentation by Dr. Roe Froman, who has practiced in Michigan and recently left private practice to join the Van Andel Research Institute, a world class cancer research institute in Michigan. The VARI recently received a million dollar "GO" (Grand Opportunities) grant from the federal government, through the National Institute of Health/National Cancer Institute, specifically to study five types of cancer that affect both dogs and humans. These cancers include hemangiosarcoma, osteosarcoma, lymphoma, malignant histiocytosis and melanoma (oral and digital). Dr. Froman coordinates sample collection with many breed clubs in addition to providing information related to this grant and its impact on OUR breed.

### Specialty - August 12

The show will be held outdoors at Hatten Park in New London, WI. Outdoor grooming space and electrical outlets will be available. Our judges are: Dana Cline - conformation and junior showmanship; Barbara Burns - sweepstakes; Lynn Tamms - obedience and rally.

### VARI Blood Sample Collection - August 11

The Health and Genetics Committee is sponsoring a blood sample collection. We are aware that many of your dogs donated blood last year for CHIC but another opportunity has been given to us. Dr. Froman, the educational from VARI, will do a no-cost draw that benefits both CHIC and VARI. Some of you may not have donated last year, and this collection would be to your advantage. VARI obtains samples, isolates the DNA at no charge, retains a small sample and then forwards the remainder to CHIC for further research. This collection can be achieved by a blood draw (which is preferred), cheek sponge or brush samples. Cancer research is the primary focus, but studies branch out into other diseases such as osteoporosis, Parkinson's disease and diabetes. Hopefully these studies will lead to improved and individualized therapies for both our dogs and people!

**Canine Good Citizen - August 12**

CGC will start at 3 PM following breed judging.

There are 10 parts to the test that demonstrate appropriate dog behaviors for social dog human interactions.

Test categories are: Accepting a friendly stranger, Sitting politely for petting, Appearance and grooming, Out for a walk (Loose leash walking), Sit and down on command and Staying in place, Coming when called, Reaction to another dog, Reaction to distraction and Supervised separation.

**Roustabout - August 13**

It is a 20 minute hunt consisting of two gunners who each have only 3 shells, one AWS and 3 planted birds. It is a timed event that gives you credit for unused time and shells, and for birds flushed, shot, and retrieved. Pre-entry is required by July 21th. NO gate entries allowed. Entry fee is \$55.

**Youth / Junior Field Handling - August 13**

This event will be for juniors 16 and under. The test will be the same as the Started Dog Test using pigeons instead of chukars. There is no entry fee for this event, but you must pre-enter by July 21st to be listed in the catalog. Prizes will be awarded.
